Other local projects were highlighted including Onamia Childcare Center and Onamia downtown space. Lake Leaf Cultivation facility behind Grand Casino Mille Lacs is 50,000 sq. ft. and is using advanced horticulture technology - each plan has its own sensor for all its needs. This created 30+ jobs for cultivation and production with more at retail sites in Hinckley, Isle and Mille Lacs. The MLCV will be using an \$11.3M grant to build their own broadband network encompassing 200+ miles during 2026. Luke Greiner, DEED provided regional data. - Manufacturing Summit and Business Tour of Glenn Metalcraft was hosted by East Central Development Partnership. Friday, October 24. A presentation was done by manufacturing technology solutions company, Factory Twin. Crystal Cabinets shared an update, and Glenn Metalcraft provided a facility tour.
- Chisago County Manufacturing Event for high school students was hosted by Chisago County HRA-EDA (CMJTS is a
 partner for this event) on October 8. This event included student tours of manufacturing employers and an
 interactive event at Splitrocks Entertainment Center. It included 6 buses of students (250-300), tours at 6
 manufacturers, and 9 employer tables. Students also attended an interactive panel presentation with several
 manufacturing students/young employees and MC Joe Mulford, President of Pine Technical and Community College.
- October 10, Pine Technical and Community College hosted their 60th anniversary, all-school reunion, and ribbon cutting/open house for the phase 1 building expansion on their campus.

East Central Development Partnership – ECDP held a November meeting at the Pine County Courthouse on Friday, 11/21. Elections were held for executive committee and planning for the coming year was completed. Key areas of focus include; Marketing Regional Assets, Acting Regionally to Support Businesses, and Fostering Organizational Vitality & Community Value. Rebecca Perrotti, CMJTS will continue as Member At Large for the ECDP Executive Committee.

Human Resources Cooperative – The HR group met online in October and November with 11 attending. Many focusing on open enrollment and sorting out processes for MN Paid Leave. Businesses shared that recruitment has been better, several are fully staffed as a change. More people seem to be staying. A couple members continue to have recruiting issues. Most group members attending feel they are now as prepared as they can be at this point for the paid leave – however a variety of logistical questions remain. Once employer noted that they may be prone to experiencing people who are eligible to go on leave due to work at other additional jobs.

Chisago County Child Care Initiative – will be hosting Carla Vita at a future meeting to share about her new role and department. Upcoming event as noted above.

Princeton Tiger Community Connections – Awarded Youth Skills Training Grant for their health sciences academy. Attended their high school Perkins meeting. The teachers for each Career and Tech Ed area shared information on the classes they offer and their wish list for equipment or future programming.

Cambridge-Isanti Schools C4 Group – 18 students have started in the new Bluejacket Advanced Manufacturing program at the high school as part of their Youth Skills Training grant. They will be modifying their spring Career Day Event and may try to include CMJTS as a resource for high school seniors who are planning to pursue employment.

East Central Regional Transit Coordinating Council – All of the local regional transit providers will be accessible on a transit platform app in the coming year. This will provide many with an easier way to access rides and services. Each provider has been adding/expanding their routes to provide more connections as they are able. More volunteer drivers still needed across the region.
